The Pasco Police Department is dedicated to serving the community with excellent law enforcement services. Team members are committed to their philosophy of quality, professional policing and outstanding customer service. Officers and staff share a vested interest in the community and continuously work to impartially enforce the law; to fight crime both by preventing it when possible and by aggressively pursuing violators as necessary; to maintain ongoing professional training and ensure the highest levels of policing for the community; and, most importantly, to value human life, with respect to the dignity of each individual, rendering services with courtesy and civility.

The Pasco Police Department is comprised of three divisions: Administration, Field Operations and Investigative Services. Among their many ongoing projects and activities, the Crime Prevention Unit develops and initiates proactive crime prevention programs by maintaining constant communications with the community through surveys, public forums, social media, radio and other service groups throughout the year. Programs include Business Watch, Citizen Academy, Crime-Free Multi-Housing, Neighborhood Watch Program and Sex Offenders Watch.

The Police Department currently has four mini-stations throughout the city. Each is staffed by an assigned officer and designed to help create a more personalized relationship between the community and the Police Department.

As Chief of Police, Bob Metzger addresses a variety of challenges on a regular basis, and he and his team know the importance of quality when it comes to leadership, communications, training, and customer service.
