A little background:

Ice Harbor Brewing Company was founded in 1996 when Mike Hall and Bill Jaquish quit their jobs at the Hanford site to pursue their dream — to start a local brewery.

Mike and Bill had both homebrewed for 10 years and had learned that great beer can only be brewed by people with a deep understanding of brewing and a driving passion for beer. Their dream was to create a place where local beer lovers could stop by to talk about beer, sample the brews and fill their refillable bottles with draft beer like in the days of old. They dreamed of being the best brewery around, with their beers proudly served throughout the Tri-Cities.

From this vision the Ice Harbor Brewing Company was born. Located in downtown Kennewick, their first brewery and pub had it all – brewing area, homebrew supply shop, offices, cold storage area, and a pub. In 2007, they opened Ice Harbor Brewing Company at the Marina for a unique dining experience on the water. And in July of 2023, they closed the original shop when they opened their new location at the west end of the Public Market at Columbia River Warehouse. This space is over twice the size of their original location.

Ice Harbor Brewing Company produces a variety of award-winning beers, including Runaway Red Ale, Sternwheeler Stout, Harvest Pale Ale, Columbia Kölsch, Hop Warrior, Dust Cloud IPA, Nut Brown Ale, and Tangerine ExBEERience Hefeweizen, Nut Brown Ale, and Maiden Washington. They also produce several flavored seltzers.

Using Lean Six Sigma to Address Four Top Cost Saving Opportunities in the Clinical Laboratory

Lean is a management philosophy that focuses on creating value for customers while minimizing waste; Six Sigma is a methodology to eliminate defects and variability. They can be applied to many industries. Healthcare is a sector that encompasses services and products critical to improving health. Within healthcare, the clinical laboratory is where medical tests are performed on patient samples to aid in diagnosis and treatment. Laboratory services leverage 60-70% of critical decision-making such as admittance, discharge, and medication. Lean Six Sigma can be applied within the clinical laboratory.

This presentation will include an overview of current laboratory industry challenges and will share how Lean Six Sigma can be used to address four top cost saving opportunities in the laboratory. Key learning objectives include:

- Brief overview of clinical laboratory reimbursement decline, as the industry backdrop necessitating targeting lab costs for reduction while maintaining patient care
- Philosophies of Lean and Six Sigma, including value creation for customers, minimization of waste, reduction of defects and variability, and creation of financial savings
- The four top cost savings opportunities in the clinical lab, and how applying Lean Six Sigma concepts can improve them

About the presenter: Katie Castree Benyo is a Client Account Lead at Accumen. In the Lab Excellence service line, she and her team of tenured lab experts assess the performance of hospital laboratories relative to their peers, recommend and implement operational efficiencies, improve quality and service results, and drive bottom line margin improvement. Using Accumen's lab performance analytics technology, they utilize benchmarks and actionable insights to provide guidance that drives lab efficiencies and monitors outcomes of process improvement.

Katie holds a bachelor's degree in Community Health from the University of Illinois, and a master's in Health Administration from Saint Louis University. She is an ASQ-Certified Six Sigma Black Belt, a TeamSTEPPS Master Trainer through AHRQ, and holds a Certificate in Laboratory Quality Management Systems from CLSI. Her work and thought leadership have been published in "Value in Health: The Journal of the International Society of Pharmaco-economics and Outcomes Research" as well as ASQ's "Lean & Six Sigma Review." She is a frequent presenter at regional and national conferences, and a member of ASQ and ACHE.

OFFICIAL CALL FOR 2025 COLUMBIA BASIN ASQ OFFICER NOMINATIONS BY AUGUST 10

This serves as the OFFICIAL CALL FOR NOMINATIONS for 2025 Columbia Basin ASQ Officers – Section Chair, Secretary, and Treasurer. Other section positions that also must be filled are Membership Chair and Nominations Chair.

Nominations are required for the Chair, Secretary and Treasurer positions. The section's Nominations Committee can make nominations of current members who meet the position requirements (usually Full/Professional, Senior, or Fellow members). Any regular section member may also nominate another eligible member (or themselves) for one of these positions by submitting a nomination petition to the section Secretary or Nominations Committee. The minimum number of required petition signatures is the lower of 4% of regular members or 10 regular members, based on section size.

All required section positions must be filled, and names submitted to ASQ for our section to continue to operate in 2025.

We would really like to see more members become active in future section activities. Please consider stepping up to serve in a leadership position!
