SURVIVING SUMMER – PROMOTING SAFETY IN WASHINGTON DURING THE MOST HAZARDOUS DAYS

(from the Washington State Patrol website)

The Washington State Patrol (WSP), Washington Traffic Safety Commission (WTSC), and partner law enforcement agencies across the state are collaborating in a statewide "Surviving Summer" campaign to reduce serious injury and fatality collisions during the 90 most dangerous days on the roadways.

The months of June, July, and August have become Washington's highest consecutive 90-day stretch for trafficrelated fatalities since 2018. According to the WTSC, more than 1206 lives were lost due to fatal crashes each summer since 2018, with law enforcement responding to an average of more than 65 fatalities per month in June, July, and August. On average, the 90 days account for more than 30% of all traffic deaths statewide.

Those at risk are not just drivers, but also vulnerable roadway users such as pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorcycle riders. Half of all motorcycle fatalities for the year occur during June, July, and August. Additionally, July is when the greatest number of bicyclist fatalities occur.

WSP troopers investigated 301 fatality collisions in 2023 – of those, 30 percent occurred during the summer months.

Of those 93 summertime tragedies:

- 31 percent involved an impaired driver
- 25 percent involved occupants not wearing their seatbelt
- 72 percent occurred on a weekday
- 44 percent occurred between the hours of noon and 7 pm

Of the WSP investigated fatality collisions during the 90 most dangerous days last year, the majority occurred on a Thursday, Friday, or Sunday.

Make a Difference – What can we do?

Plan ahead before you hit the road: Check for traffic conditions and pack your patience, especially if traveling in unfamiliar areas

Be on alert for vulnerable road users: This includes pedestrians, motorcycle riders, and bicyclists – we all share the roads.

Focus on driving when behind the wheel: Always buckle up, adhere to posted speed limits, drive sober, and stay distraction free.

Secure all your items before leaving: Heading out on a road trip? Make sure all your belongings are stowed safely. More information on this topic can be found <u>here</u>.

A little background:

Ice Harbor Brewing Company was founded in 1996 when Mike Hall and Bill Jaquish quit their jobs at the Hanford site to pursue their dream — to start a local brewery. Mike and Bill had both homebrewed for 10 years and had learned that great beer can only be brewed by people with a deep understanding of brewing and a driving passion for beer. Their dream was to create a place where local beer lovers could stop by to talk about beer, sample the brews and fill their refillable bottles with draft beer like in the days of old. They dreamed of being the best brewery around, with their beers proudly served throughout the Tri-Cities.

From this vision the Ice Harbor Brewing Company was born. Located in downtown Kennewick, their first brewery and pub had it all – brewing area, homebrew supply shop, offices, cold storage area, and a pub. In 2007, they opened Ice Harbor Brewing Company at the Marina, for a unique dining experience on the water. And in July of 2023, they closed the original shop when they opened their new location at the west end of the Public Market at Columbia River Warehouse. This space is over twice the size of their original location.

Ice Harbor Brewing Company produces a variety of award-winning beers, including Runaway Red Ale, Sternwheeler Stout, Harvest Pale Ale, Columbia Kölsch, Hop Warrior, Dust Cloud IPA, Nut Brown Ale, and Tangerine ExBEERience Hefeweizen, Nut Brown Ale, and Maiden Washington. They also produce several flavored seltzers.
