Later, as part-owner of a small engineering-fabrication firm, she developed its nuclear quality assurance program compliant with ASME NQA-1 and managed the fabrication shop operations. Shortly after joining AECOM in 2000, Denise was named Chief Quality Officer for one of AECOM's early operating companies, DMJM Holmes & Narver. In that role she successfully introduced the first ISO 9001-certified quality management system for the company. In subsequent years she successfully led multiple mergers of disparate quality management systems into a coherent whole while maintaining ISO 9001 certification. Denise also worked with AECOM developers to program systems for streamlining project management workflows, internal auditing through online tools linked to the financial system for analysis, and a supplier prequalification tool.

Innovation Certification: The Creation of ISO 56001



Peter Merrill President, Quest Management, Inc. Author, Keynote Speaker, ASQ Board Member

ISO 56001 will be an internationally accepted auditable innovation management system (IMS) standard that will enable IMS certification. It is due to be published in 2024. Peter Merrill is the international project lead for this new standard.

Peter will take participants through the clauses of the standard and show key audit points. In both structure and text, ISO 56001 uses the Harmonized Structure for ISO Management System Standards and will integrate with ISO 9001. An effective Quality Management System (QMS) is the platform for an effective IMS. Companies who are serial innovators have a system approach to innovation and continuously generate new ideas.

The demand for this standard comes from organizations who want drive rigor in their Innovation Management, financing organizations who want assurance they are providing finance to an organization with an effective IMS, and innovative organizations seeking to partner with other innovators. Research has shown that 95% of innovators partner with others.

<u>About the speaker:</u> Peter Merrill is a well-known author, consultant, and speaker. He began his career in R&D in a major UK corporation and later as Chief Executive of a leading Design Brand corporation where he led Innovation in one of the most demanding markets. He is one of North America's foremost authorities on Management Systems which he has implemented in such innovative companies as IBM, A.I.G., and BlackBerry.

Peter was the founding chair of the ASQ Innovation Division and is currently a member of the ASQ Board of Directors. He is the international project lead on ISO 56001, the new auditable innovation standard. His books include Innovation Generation, Innovation Never Stops, and ISO-56000, Building Innovation into your QMS.

STATISTICAL RELIABILITY CONTROL

San Francisco ASQ Section Virtual Webinar October 15 from 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm PDT

Statistical process control (SPC) or statistical quality control (SQC) should be applied to reliability function estimates. SPC and SQC apply to proportions failing to meet specifications, not to reliability functions. Imagine Statistical Reliability Control (SRC) on successive reliability function estimates such as broom charts. Broom charts are graphs of successive reliability estimates as cohorts of ships add to the population.

Presenter Larry George will discuss all of these terms and processes and provide insights into their application.

ADVANCED QUALITY AUDITING: AN AUDITOR'S REVIEW OF RISK MANAGEMENT, LEAN IMPROVEMENT, AND DATA ANALYSIS

Book by Lance B. Coleman, Sr.

Auditors from any industry must "learn the language of upper management" if they truly want to effect positive change throughout their environments. If quality auditors want to remain relevant and keep from becoming marginalized, they need to add new skills and credentials and, even more importantly, move beyond conformance monitoring to determine how their work might impact the corporate bottom line.

The purpose of this book is to accept that challenge in presenting two ways that auditors can learn [to speak] the language of upper management - either by helping to drive continuous improvement or by helping to manage risk. It includes essential information to help guide an organization's efforts to glean more value from their audit process. This helps grow the audit function beyond verification audits. The author also provides insight into using the audit function to improve organizations using lean principles and discusses how the audit function can contribute to and be formally integrated into the ongoing risk management program.
