CHAIR'S CORNER – MASTERING ESSENTIAL COMMUNICATION SKILLS

Communication skills are the abilities you use to exchange information, ideas, and feelings. They include listening, speaking, observing, and empathizing.

I recently read an article online from the Indeed Editorial Team on this topic. Here are some of the useful tips they provided.

- Clarity Make it easy for others to understand your main ideas
- Concision Get to the point without using extra words
- **Concreteness** Use specific examples or explanations
- Correctness Use the right information, grammar, and word choice
- Coherence Present information in a logical order

Other communication skills:

- Active listening Pay attention to what others are saying, beyond just hearing the words
- Empathy Try to understand and share the emotions of others
- Nonverbal communication Use body language, facial expressions, and tone of voice to enhance your spoken message
- Oral communication Speak clearly, concisely, and without being misunderstood
- Written communication Exchange information through written language, such as in emails or texts
- Confidence Speak clearly, listen well, and get your message across

How To Improve Your Communication Skills?

With experience and practice, you can learn and improve communication skills. Start by identifying your strengths and then practice and develop those areas.

- Ask a close friend or colleague for constructive criticism
- Practice improving communication habits
- Attend communication skills workshops or classes
- Seek opportunities to communicate

LIONS AND LAMBS AND CHANGE ... OH MY!

March 2025

We've probably all heard the saying "March comes in like a Lion and goes out like a Lamb," right? There are conflicting theories about the origin, but it most likely began as a reference to the position of the constellations Leo (a lion) and Aries (a ram or lamb) in the night sky. Then at some point it evolved into a fairly good summation of March's weather as the seasons change from winter to spring.

March is an interesting month, often beginning with (a lion's roar of) very chilly weather and (a lion's long, white teeth) winds so biting that we still need our down-filled parkas. By the end of the month, as temperatures rise and we see more of the sun every day, the weather feels softer, kinder, and more temperate, like the warmth of a lamb's fluffy white fleece.

This proverb has stood the test of time. It can be traced back to Thomas Fuller's 1732 compendium, "Gnomologia; Adagies and Proverbs; Wise Sentences and Witty Sayings, Ancient and Modern, Foreign and British." Along with other writings at the time, it contained a lot of weather folklore, intended to help people prepare for typical weather conditions that lay ahead, and often in relation to the planting and harvesting of crops. And a lot of the information was pretty accurate, due to expected winds and weather patterns.

As we begin the month of March, are you feeling more like a lion or a lamb? Are you dealing with changes not only in the weather but also in your professional and personal life in a positive way? We often tend to think of "change" as being something negative, but there are also a lot of positive changes. I have a friend from high school who is now retired and getting ready for a move to Portugal. The activities associated with making such a big change can be stressful, but she is excited about moving to a new place and starting new adventures.

How do we adapt to changes? Sometimes like a lion: brave, protective, willing to fight when needed, group (pride) members, but also sometimes loners in the bigger scheme of things. Sometimes like a lamb: hardworking, soft-hearted, feeling safer in the flock. Of course, there are many other characteristics of lions and sheep, and even some overlapping ones.

What's the best way to cope with change? Try to stay positive and be proactive. Refuse to be a "victim" of change; instead, acknowledge and then manage your feelings, get support if needed, create a strategy, and do whatever you can to be an active, contributing part of the change.

Some other strategies: 1) Acknowledge the change; 2) Plan ahead (if possible); 3) Reframe your thinking (an opportunity for growth); 4) Maintain some normalcy (some familiar routines and activities); and 5) Build a support system (friends/family to help you navigate through change – and thrive!).

Artificial Intelligence for Business

Generative AI is a subset of artificial intelligence that can create original content such as text, images, videos, audio, or software code in response to user prompts. This technology relies on sophisticated machine learning models, which simulate the learning and decision-making processes of the human brain. These models identify and encode patterns and relationships in vast amounts of data, enabling them to understand natural language requests and generate relevant new content.

Generative AI has uses across a wide range of industries. However, there are also concerns about the potential misuse of generative AI such as cybercrime, the use of fake news or deepfakes to deceive or manipulate people, and the potential replacement of human jobs.

The public release of ChatGPT in 2022 revolutionized the accessibility and application of generative AI for general purpose text-based tasks. The system's ability to engage in natural conversations, generate creative content, assist with coding, and perform various analytical tasks captured global attention and sparked widespread discussion about AI's potential impact on work, education, and creativity.

Generative AI, ChatGPT, and other tools are being used by just about everyone today. This presentation will focus on Generative AI and artificial intelligence, what it is, and examples of how to use it in business and other applications.

<u>About the speakers:</u> Kaleokalani Kuroda joined HawaiiUSA Federal Credit Union in 2006 and has served as Chief Operating Officer since 2023. A key aspect of his role there involves utilizing member feedback to connect work across the organization to improve satisfaction and embed learning into workflows. Six Sigma ASQ Green Belt – Part 1

At the project level, there are master black belts, black belts, green belts, yellow belts, and white belts. These individuals conduct projects and implement improvements. Six Sigma professionals exist at every level – each with a different role to play.

The Six Sigma Green Belt operates in support of or under the supervision of a Six Sigma Black Belt, analyzes and solves quality problems, and participates in quality improvement projects. A Green Belt is someone with at least three years of work experience who wants to demonstrate their knowledge of Six Sigma tools and processes.

ASQ certification is a formal recognition that an individual has demonstrated proficiency within, and comprehension of, a specific body of knowledge.

This presentation is "part 1" of a two-part series designed to provide a condensed yet comprehensive introduction to the core concepts required for the ASQ Green Belt certification exam. Over two, 2-hour sessions, participants will gain a foundational understanding of Six Sigma methodologies, including the DMAIC framework, critical quality tools, and their practical applications. The sessions will equip attendees with the knowledge and confidence needed to pursue Green Belt certification and implement process improvement projects more effectively.

Note: Part 2 will be presented later in the year.

<u>About the Speaker</u>: Matthew Cameron is a Lean Six Sigma business owner, manufacturing and management consultant, trainer, and business developer. He is an ASQ Six Sigma Black Belt, with extensive experience in quality management, process improvement, and teaching. Matthew holds a dual Executive MBA with honors from UCLA and the National University of Singapore, as well as a Bachelor of Science in Chemistry from the University of Tennessee. He currently serves as Publicity Chair for the Temecula ASQ section, where he focuses on fostering knowledge-sharing and professional development within the quality community.

MEASUREMENT UNCERTAINTY: KNOWING THE UNKNOWN

Calibration is often defined as "an act of measurement and/or adjustment." Legal Metrology as well as Industrial Metrology are integral to business success, but without effective and timely calibration along with understanding the associated error sources that success will be compromised. Traceability and measurement uncertainty adds complexity to the process.

Every physical measurement in research and industry involves some degree of uncertainty. Even minor fluctuations in conditions can influence the measurement and lead to deviations that make the measurement result unreliable. Knowledge of the uncertainty pertaining to the results is essential in order to obtain meaningful measurement data.

The Certified Medical Device Auditor (CMDA) is a professional who understands the principles of standards, regulations, directives, and guidance for auditing a medical device system while using various tools and techniques to examine, question, evaluate, and report on that system's adequacies and deficiencies.

A medical device auditor analyzes all elements of the system and reports on how well it adheres to the criteria for management and control of process safety.

This course with instructors Upen Patel, Vinay Goyal, Bob Mehta, George Phillips and Karen Grams will cover key topics related to ASQ's Certified Medical Device Auditor (CMDA) body of knowledge through ten (10) Saturday sessions.
