ASQ E-LEARNING

ASQ offers many courses in quality-related topics, available as in-person events and e-learning. You can earn ASQ Recertification Units for completing training, and most courses are self-paced, allowing 90 days (or more) to complete.

Here are just a few of the e-learning courses currently offered:

Auditing Fundamentals I: This course helps identify steps needed to prepare, perform, report, and follow up on an audit. Cost for this 8-hour internet-based course is only \$188 for ASQ members; more information is available here.

Continual Improvement Assessment (CIA): This course is ideal for managers and auditors interested in making continual improvement programs more effective. It covers how audit program strategies can lower risk and improve organizational effectiveness by auditing for continual improvement. Cost for this 8-hour online course is \$179 for ASQ members; more information can be found here.

Statistical Process Control (SPC) Basics: This course covers how to work on an SPC team to rid a process of special causes of variation and to avoid unnecessary adjustments to the process. It explains methods for selecting which parameters to control and which type of control chart to use. The cost for this 5-hour self-paced course is \$149 for members; additional information is available here.

MEMORIAL DAY 2025

(excerpted from a Reader's Digest article)

Memorial Day is observed on the last Monday in May. It is considered a federal holiday in the United States, a day to honor and mourn members of the military who have passed away while serving in the United States Armed Forces.

History of Memorial Day

Originally known as Decoration Day, Memorial Day began with an idea from General John Logan as a way to honor the fallen soldiers of the Civil War. The first celebration, on May 30, 1868, was held at Arlington National Cemetery, with a crowd of 5.000 people decorating the graves of more than 20.000 military personnel with flowers. Most experts believe General Logan planned the first Decoration Day for that day because northern and southern states would have flowers in bloom by then, though others believe the date was ideal because it didn't coincide with the anniversary of any battles.

Various Washington officials presided over the ceremonies. including General Ulysses S. Grant. Following several speeches, children from the Soldiers' and Sailors' Orphan Home, among others, made their way through the cemetery, scattering flowers on both Union and Confederate graves, reciting prayers, and singing hymns. Many attendees also came prepared with picnic lunches.

It wasn't until after World War I that Memorial Day was expanded to honor all veterans who died in any American war. In 1971, Decoration Day became officially known as Memorial Day, and Congress passed an act declaring it a national holiday.

There are a number of Memorial Day activities that individuals and families enjoy participating in every year, and there are also some very meaningful Memorial Day traditions you can honor:

Red (remembrance) poppies (symbol of war casualties)

National Moment of Remembrance (3:00 pm local time Flying a flag at half-staff (until noon)

Playing or listening to "Taps" (bugle call)

Visiting a local veterans cemetery (as the years go by, many veterans no longer have family nearby; consider bringing flowers to a grave that doesn't have any)



SUPPORT NEEDED FOR NEW WOMEN'S AND CHILDREN'S SHELTER

Tri-City Union Gospel Mission

The Tri-City Union Gospel Mission has raised about \$4.2 million of the \$9.5 million needed to build a new women's and children's shelter in Kennewick.

The facility will replace the cramped, 100-plus-year-old building in downtown Pasco, whose size and condition seriously limits the number of women and children the Mission can serve. There is not enough space for separate rooms for women with children, there are electrical and plumbing problems, and there is no place for children to play outside.

The Mission's New Life program focuses on faith-centered recovery and long-term success by addressing spiritual. physical, and mental health needs. Participants also learn to build skills for successful living and managing their lives.

The new shelter is planned to be around 23,000 square feet with room for up to 60 long-term beds. Not only will it function as an emergency shelter, but it will also have apartments equipped for stays of up to two years. There will also be classroom and job training space, room for counselors, and indoor and outdoor play areas for children.

The planned location, near the Toyota Center, will allow for easy access to the Three Rivers Transit Center and a number of nearby jobs. More information about the Mission, their programs, and how you can help can be found here.
